### NOTICE OF RACE

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2005 – 2008* except as changed by, in order of precedence, Seasalter Sailing Club Sailing Instructions and this Notice of Race.
- 1.2 Seasalter Sailing Club is the organising authority for the regatta.
- 1.3 The following prescriptions of the RYA (the national authority) will apply: 50.4, 68, 70.4, 78, 86.3, 87, Appendices F & G, Regulation 20 and Addendum A (RYA) Clauses 1 to 5 inclusive.
- 1.4 Racing rules 26, 27.1, 27.3, 35, 40.1, 44.1, 44.2, 60.1(a), 61.3, 62.2, 63.1, A4, A4.1 and Race Signals will be changed. The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.5 Rule(s) of the accepted classes will not apply.
- 1.6 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

#### 2 ADVERTISING

Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

#### 3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all centreboard and multihull dinghies with a nationally recognised PY number.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter the appropriate race by completing the regatta entry form and handing it, together with the required fee, at reception (which will be located in the briefing area). Such entry is to be made no later than 1 hour before the scheduled warning signal of the appropriate race (see paragraph 6) in which the boat wishes to compete.
- 3.3 Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions: at the Chief Race Officer's discretion and where acceptance of such late entry will not delay the start of the race being entered.
- 3.4 The following restrictions on the total number of boats apply: 45 at the date of issue of this Notice of Race.

#### 4 CLASSIFICATION

The ISAF Sailor Classification Code will apply.

#### 5 FEES

- 5.1 The entry fee will be £10 per boat
- 5.2 Meals and refreshments will be available in the Club as follows:

Light Refreshments (at galley prices) available from the galley from 11:00 until the prizegiving on the day of racing

The Club bar will be open for sales as follows: 18:00 to 22:30 on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September  
12:00 to 15:00 on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September

For those wishing to arrive on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September to camp on the club premises please contact the organisers (Paragraph 14 below) for details of facilities that may be available on that date.

#### 6 SCHEDULE

- 6.1 **Registration:** The reception desk will be open for registration from 10:30 on the day of racing until 1 hour before the scheduled warning signal for the first race.
- 6.2 Date of racing: **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2006.** (No practice races will be held)
- 6.3 **Number of races:** (subject to weather conditions and number of entries)
  - 1 race for monohull dinghies with PY greater than 950
  - 1 race for multihull dinghies and monohull dinghies with PY less than 950
  - These races will be generally concurrent but may have separate start, course and finish
- 6.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race away is: **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September 12:40 pm**

## 7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available from 18:00 on Friday 8th September at the reception desk.

## 8 VENUE

- 8.1 The Club is located at the address shown at the head of this page. A map can be requested by using the contacts as shown in paragraph 14 below or can be obtained by using links from the club website at [www.seasaltersailing.org.uk](http://www.seasaltersailing.org.uk).
- 8.2 The Race Area will be designated on the Course Chart in the briefing area on the day of racing from approximately 1 hour before the scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race of the day.
- 8.3 Although the Race Area will not normally be local to the Seasalter Sailing Club premises the Start Line will, in normal weather conditions, be visible from the launching area.
- 8.4 The Seasalter Sailing Club will be open for arrival of boats and those wishing to camp:  
19:00 - 22:00 on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September,  
10:00 - 11:30 on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September,  
The premises will be closed from 2 hours after prizegiving on Saturday 9th September (approximately 18:00).
- 8.5 The Club field can be used, free of charge from Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September and during the regatta, for camping and parking of cars and boats in accordance with the conditions imposed by Canterbury City Council (displayed on the Health and Safety noticeboard in the briefing area) and the Club Byelaws. The field must be cleared by 2 hours after prizegiving unless prior separate arrangements are made with the organisers. There is a limit of 6 caravans on this field and you are advised to make prior contact with the Club (paragraph 14 below) to book a plot. There is also adequate free public parking adjacent to the Club premises.
- 8.6 **Due to the very high tides predicted for the days before, during and after the regatta entrants are recommended NOT to park boats on the Seasalter beach except to launch and recover boats for the race.**

## 9 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be shown on the Course Chart in the briefing area from approximately 1 hour before the scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race of the day. Entrants should refer to Sailing Instruction 8.

## 10 PENALTY SYSTEM

The penalties are as follows: Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe in either order, is required.

## 11 SCORING

11.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.

11.2 The scoring system is as follows:

RYA published PY numbers shall be used to calculate corrected time for each separate race

**12 PRIZES**

Prizes will be given as follows:

The Open Fowley Cup will be awarded to the highest placed Seasalter Sailing Club boat with PY less than 950.

The Open Fowley Trophy will be awarded to the highest placed Seasalter Sailing Club boat with PY greater than 950.

Token prizes will also be awarded to the first three boats in each race in the regatta.

**13 ADDENDUM A (RYA)**

13.1 Clauses 1 to 5 inclusive of Addendum A (RYA) as published on yellow page 103 of Appendix J in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2005-2008 shall apply.

13.2 In respect of Clause 3 of the Addendum A (RYA) the minimum insurance cover required, for each and every claim, shall be £2,000,000.

**14 FURTHER INFORMATION**

14.1 Changes to Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions: All changes will be posted at least 1 hour before the scheduled time for the warning signal for the race that such changes will affect.
